

Chuck Close, Self-Portrait, 1999

Chuck close is best known as a painter, but has often used photography as an intermediary process. His Photorealist paintings begin as tightly cropped photographs, then are transferred to a canvas using a Renaissance grid system, dividing up the canvas into a series of squares and then transcribing them one square at a time. This large photographic self-portrait underscores a central theme of his work--that the subjects of Close's works are not the individual sitters, but rather the dispassionately scrutinizing views of the camera lens itself. Selfportrait, a recent acquisition of Carnegie Museum of Art, can be seen in On Paper III, May 21 though October 9 in the Works on Paper Gallery.
